






TIMELINE FOR YOUTH JUSTICE



WHO ARE YOUTH JUSTICE SUPPORTING?



In comparison:

- 14 x more likely to have spent a year in a care and protection placement
- 6 x more likely to have a parent in prison in last 2 years.
- 23 x more likely to have been suspended from school in the last year



RAISING THE AGE

THE IMMEDIATE DRIVER OF CHANGE

- From 1 July 2019, Oranga Tamariki will now manage vulnerable 17-18 year olds
- Around 1000 young people
- We have to offer something new, different, and more effective than before
- This year, our focus is on preparation, including;
 - additional resources for placements,
 - building capacity with partners,
 - expanding our practice capacity & capability



RESPONSIBILITY UNDER SECTION 7AA

- Embedding a Mana Rangatahi focused Youth Justice operating model
- Maximising opportunities to build new pathways out of offending
- Addressing known weaknesses in YJ system in outcomes for Māori, and for the least resilient rangatahi
