Oranga Tamariki – Ministry for Children is the part of the Government that works to make things better for children.



Oranga Tamariki has been finding out about supporting **oranga** for **tāngata whaikaha**.





Oranga is about living well.

In this document **tāngata whaikaha** means disabled people.



Oranga Tamariki has been listening to what tāngata whaikaha have to say about the:

- care system
- youth justice system.



The **care system** is how children who cannot live with their parents are looked after.



The **youth justice system** deals with young people who have broken the law.





Oranga Tamariki has also been finding out things by:

- listening to other people who work with children
- looking at things written in the past 10 years about these systems.




There are 6 Easy Read documents about changes to the systems.

The documents are about what Oranga Tamariki found out about:



- the experiences of tangata whaikaha / disabled people
- what is best to do because of those experiences.

This document is about what Oranga Tamariki found out about making **social work** better.

Social work is about supporting people with things like:

- keeping safe
- having somewhere to live
- getting other kinds of support.

The people who do this work are called social workers.

What tāngata whaikaha / disabled people told Oranga Tamariki









Tāngata whaikaha / disabled people told Oranga Tamariki that they:

- need support even if they do not fit the rules for some services
- want to be listened to
- want to be treated kindly
- want to be told the truth
- want to have time to think about things which means they are not told them at the last minute
- need to trust the people who support them so it feels safe to talk about important things.



Tāngata whaikaha / disabled people also told Oranga Tamariki that the way people work with them / their whānau can be:

- disempowering
- harmful.



Disempowering means taking away the power people have over their own lives.



Tāngata whaikaha / disabled people also told us that people who support them do not get the information they need.

Ideas for change











Tāngata whaikaha / disabled people and other people supporting children had these ideas for change:

- information on how social workers should work should include information about supporting tamariki whaikaha / disabled children
- there should be experts for when social workers need more support for whānau
- social workers should be given more time to work well with young people
- make ways to support tamariki whaikaha who may not have medical diagnoses.



Experts are people who know a lot about something.



Diagnoses are when doctors say you have a health condition.

Tāngata whaikaha / disabled people and other people supporting children also said support networks should get:

- the right information
- at the right time.









Tāngata whaikaha / disabled people and other people supporting children also said that everyone working with tamariki needs training on:

- how to work with tangata whaikaha / disabled people
- how to support tāngata whaikaha Māori
- how to support disabled Pacific people.
